

## SLSC22: HOW TO RETRIEVE AND READ SCORECARDS

1. Visit: <https://www.skillsusa-register.org/rpts/EventScoreDetails.aspx>
2. Select Event and Year: FL – 2022 State Leadership and Skills Conference
3. Select your contest: Be sure to select the correct contest AND division
4. Round: Select “Final”
5. Enter your Contestant Number: What was displayed on your name badge during the competition
6. Enter your Date of Birth (mm/dd/yyyy) – Must match what was entered at registration!

- You must have your contestant number and date of birth to retrieve your scorecard. If you do not have this information, you may email [jaydev@skillsusafli.org](mailto:jaydev@skillsusafli.org) to request that information.
  - o Requests may only be made by individual contestants for their own identifying information – we will NOT provide you access to someone else's scores.
  - o Include your name, contest name, and school name in the request. To expedite the process, it is suggested that you use the same email address that was used for your online testing.
  - o Requests will be handled as capacity allows, and we ask for your patience with this process.
- If no score is present for the highest or lowest score attained, that scoring component was NOT scored.
- If your score seems low, pay attention to the highest and lowest score attained. In some cases, the total score for everyone was lower than the criteria.
- If you receive no score for a penalty, this means no penalty was awarded.
- Remember: All scorecards were reviewed to determine eligibility for the national conference. If you awarded a gold medal in an eligible contest, you were extended an invitation to the national competition, even if your percentage score was less than 70%.
